National Achievement Survey – Class VIII & X



The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) conducted National а Achievement Survey-2021 on November 12, 2021. It is an Assessment Framework for gauging the competencies attained by the student's vis-a-vis learning outcomes. Holy Child Sr. Sec. School was selected as one of the schools to conduct this survey in school premises. Students of classes VIII and X participated with great enthusiasm. The Survey surpasses the academics and includes the background variables to correlate students' performance in different learning outcomes vis-avis contextual variables. These findings would help diagnose learning gaps of students and determine interventions required in education policies, teaching practices and learning. With the findings derived from these diagnostic report cards, NAS helps in capacity building for teachers and officials involved in the delivery of education. NAS gives a system-level reflection on the effectiveness of school education. Findings also help to compare the performance across the spectrum in order to find the desired direction for improvements.

Origin of the United Nations Organization (UNO)

UNO Day is observed on 24th October every year. The UNO originated from the Atlantic Charter drawn in the year 1941 which guaranteed the principle of equality of states and their freedom to choose any form of government. In 1942, the representatives of twenty-six countries put their signatures to the United Nations Declaration drawn on the lines of the Atlantic Charter. Generally, the Secretary General is the head of the UNO.

In the year 1945, the United Nations Charter was drawn up by the representatives of fifty countries at San Francisco on the basis of proposals by England, USA, Russia and China. The four basic objectives of UNO are: to maintain peace and security all over the world, to develop friendly relations among the nations of the world, to promote the social and economic progress of the world and to offer a common centre for mobilization of world opinion and actions. The UNO has six organs, namely- (1) The General Assembly; (2) The Security Council; (3) The Economic and Social Council; (4) The Trusteeship Council; (5) The International Court of Justice and (6) The Secretariat.

At present there are 193 members in the UNO.




JOURNEY OF A MATH TEACHER- in view of Art Integration

If you are a teacher, you are probably an artist too. Everyday teachers play different roles in the lives of their students. Be it a dancer, poet, painter or a dramatist. Art Integration is an approach wherein students are given opportunities to get engaged in a creative process that connects the art form with the subject matter consequently meeting the learning objectives.

As per my prior experience, I have observed that there will always be some students in every class who do not find a particular subject interesting. Art integration has made me believe that nothing is difficult when it comes to teaching



logical subjects such as Mathematics. Through Art integration, teachers can alter their ways to make the students understand those mind-boggling topics.



Online Teaching has taught me to come up with different techniques in teaching which enables students to understand Mathematics better thereby proving that Distance Learning is a boon as well.

From doodling in digits, reciting poems in addition class to drawing a scenery in division class, I discovered many ways in

which the topics can be integrated. Unique and funny abbreviations helped the students to learn the steps of Multiplication and Division. After taking many online classes, I noticed that if the teaching methods are somehow co-related to a child's environment, he/she gets more involved. For instance, while teaching basic operations of Mathematics, the abbreviations which I came up with were related to their parents which ensured that the kids never forget the steps of Multiplication or Division.



It was really an enriching experience for the students as well as me, of having virtual fun learning activities such as Mental Maths parties, the multiplication table dances, enactment of word problems and digital games. Some of the sessions included games like Bingo and Tambola which acted as a catalyst to boost excitement level of kids. Due to all these methods of teaching, even the academically weaker students participated enthusiastically which resulted in quick and better understanding of the topics. To conclude, Art Integration has not only made the students feel comfortable and confident with the subject but also the teachers have



explored a different talent in themselves by discovering, creating and executing fun learning activities. It has widened our horizons from being a subject teacher to an art integrated subject teacher. At the end, I would like to conclude by saying that I not only have gained more confidence of my students and also have received a lot of personal satisfaction.

I am your school


